

This year I'm choosing to boycott National Public Service Week activities to send you a message that it takes more than hot dogs and ice cream to show you appreciate us. Public service workers deserve better.

- We deserve to be able to offer Canadians the services they rely on without barriers from budget freezes and job cuts. These cuts have devastated public services. We need your government to invest in public services and help us do the jobs we love.
- We deserve respect at the bargaining table. As we head into bargaining we want your government to give Treasury Board a mandate to bargain in good faith and to improve working conditions for all public service workers.

- We deserve to maintain our negotiated benefits. Treasury
  Board President Clement has already said he intends to
  dismantle our sick leave and benefits, and we're hearing
  rumblings about more changes to our pension plan. Relying
  on austerity measures and rollbacks is not good for the
  economy or Canadians.
- We deserve to have our union's support in the workplace. Your government has supported Bill C-377, Bill C-525 and Bill C-4, three pieces of blatantly anti-labour legislation. Please stop disrespecting workers, their unions and Canadian labour.

Public service workers want real respect, not empty gestures.
