1. Occupational Health and Safety and the Act and Regulations

The purpose of this workshop is to provide activists with a working knowledge of how the Act and Regulations apply. The workshop will also address how committees are intended to work, their responsibilities and the individual's role as a union member. Recommended for new

2. Effective OH&S Working Committees

Want to learn how to make your Occupational Health and Safety Committee more effective? This course is designed for those workers who have experience working on OH&S Committees. If you have not taken previous courses on the OH&S Act and Regulations this workshop is **not** for you.

3. <u>Harassment Investigation in the Workplace</u>

An in-depth examination of harassment investigation in the workplace based upon the prohibited grounds. This is an advanced harassment workshop dealing with tools and procedures for dealing with allegations of harassment. We will look at how to complete an investigation.

4. <u>Workers' Compensation</u>

This workshop will review the Workers' Compensation Act and Review process. It will communicate and promote an understanding of workers' compensation and provide oral and written information on how to apply, appeal, use and complete forms, etc. We will look at the current trends in Workers' Compensation, new developments in the system (return to work/early intervention). We will examine how these changes impact/benefit workers.

5. Ergonomics – How does work hurt us?

How can we make our workplace safer? What are Ergonomic related hazards? These are some of the questions that workers pose about their workplaces every day. This workshop will give the participants a basic overview on the fundamentals of ergonomics including general principles of ergonomics, task analysis, manual material handling, office ergonomics as well as measures that can be taken for the prevention of repetitive strain and overuse injuries. The participants will learn how to integrate ergonomics related hazards into their inspections, and we will examine some strategies for making your workplace safer.

6. Identifying Workplace Stress and Psychological Abuse

This workshop develops an understanding of how workplace stress and other psychosocial hazards can affect us and how to deal with them. The workshop will help identify stressors such as job demands, job control, lack of support and violence/bullying which result in a lack of work life balance. We will work on solutions and prevention strategies to reduce stress and eliminate psychosocial hazards. This course is applicable to all workers and OH&S committee members.

7. <u>Creating a "Culture" of Safety in the Workplace</u>

This workshop will help workers have a better understanding of how being involved in creating a "culture" of safety at work is a benefit to all workers. We will provide tools that will assist you and your co-workers in identifying OH&S trends that target workers rather than solve problems. We will have a discussion around the abuse and exploitation of vulnerable Temporary Foreign Workers and how we can better understand issues facing these workers.

8. <u>Duty to Accommodate</u>

This workshop will examine how disabled workers are brought back to the workplace. What is the duty of employers, unions and employees? What considerations must be provided to workers?

Please note workshops begin Thursday afternoon and run until Saturday noon. You will be in only one workshop at the Conference. The Committee will limit the number of people in a workshop based on a first registered - first preference basis. **Register early!!**
