Since the 2008 global financial crisis, workers and their families around the world have found themselves under multiple attacks and threats from job insecurity, unemployment, increased debt, government austerity measures, privacy violations, environmental disasters and wars. In response, people and organizations, including unions, have fought back through lobbying, demonstrations, strikes and other means. However these have been mostly sporadic and separate. The Peoples' Social Forum will bring together people from across the country to discuss and plan how to strengthen and coordinate efforts to make our country more equitable, democratic and environmentally responsible.

The Peoples' Social Forum will also be a joyous gathering with special exhibitions, workshops, peoples' history tours, film screenings, a massive rally, a pow-wow, street performances, concerts and games. The Peoples' Social Forum is a means of stimulating debate, discussion and furthering our sense of community and collective action.

PSAC will host four workshops during the Peoples' Social Forum

1) Two days of Workshops:

Two days of 1-1/2 hour workshops will take place at the University of Ottawa and surrounding venues to address what is happening with federal public services in Canada and what the drastic cuts in government programs mean for both Canadians and public service employees

- 1) The Fight for Public Services: The Fight against Inequality
- 2) The face of Public Service Cuts: Impact on Equity and Community Groups
- 3) Showdown with Stephen Harper: Confronting Austerity at the Bargaining Table
- 4) Rights of Mother Earth

2) Movement Assemblies

Following the workshops, there will be a day of "movement assemblies" that will bring together labour and community organizations to develop a common plan for action. The PSAC along with other public sector unions are organizing an assembly on the issue of austerity and public services.

Other Workshop Themes adopted by Peoples' Social Forum include:

- Climate: justice responsibility action
- Earth: land air water
- **Gender:** sexuality patriarchy socialization
- Governance & Democracy: representation organization decolonization
- Migration: mobility borders displacement
